Successful Lecture series by the "Nicos Svoronos" Institute

The Institute for Humanities and Culture "Nicos Svoronos" held a highly engaging lecture event on **Monday, 18 November 2024**, at the EPLO Plaka premises. The event, titled "*Religious Phenomenon and the Public Sphere: Jurisprudential Developments and Practical Illustration*," brought together esteemed legal experts and scholars to discuss critical intersections between religion and the public domain.

The lecture series featured the following distinguished speakers:

- **Michael Th. Papageorgiou:** Lawyer and Assistant Professor of Constitutional & Administrative Law at the Democritus University of Thrace. His lecture focused on "*The Administrative Organization of Churches and Religions in European Constitutional Law*," exploring the jurisprudence of the CJEU and ECtHR alongside institutional challenges faced by the Ecumenical Patriarchate.
- **Aikaterini Roxana:** Councilor of State, who discussed "*The Teaching of Religion in School Education and the Right to Exemption in the Light of the Jurisprudence of the Council of State*."
- **George I. Androutsopoulos:** Associate Professor of Ecclesiastical Law at NKUA and Lawyer, who delved into "*Issues of Administration of Justice in the Semi-Autonomous Church of Crete*."
- **Eleni M. Palioura:** Lawyer, PhD Candidate of Law at NKUA, and Legal Adviser of the Anglican Church in Greece. Her presentation examined "*Ten Years of Validity and Implementation of Law 4301/2014: The Example of the Anglican Church in Greece*."

The discussion was expertly moderated by **Mrs. Kalliopi (Kelly) Burdara**, Emeritus Professor at the University of Athens School of Law (EKPA).

Attendees were treated to a rich dialogue that blended jurisprudential analysis with practical insights, shedding light on the dynamic interplay between religion, law, and society.
