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Circular Gaia Symposium 2025

The Circular Economy and Climate Institute of the European Public Law Organization (EPLO) successfully held the *Circular Gaia Symposium 2025*, a two-day international conference dedicated to advancing dialogue on sustainability, climate resilience, and the circular economy.

The symposium took place on **Thursday, 2 October 2025**, at the historic **Zappeion Megaron in Athens**, and continued on **Friday, 3 October 2025**, at the EPLO premises within the **Roman Agora in Plaka**.

The **Circular Gaia Symposium** once again brought together leading policymakers, experts, academics, and representatives of civil society, reaffirming its role as a transformative platform for promoting circularity as a cornerstone of sustainable development.
